
Melbourne Cup, Tuesday 7th November

The AGM Sunday 3rd December 2023

54 club members attended the AGM and as well as "the usual" formalities of an AGM a resolution was unanimously passed:

The committee is authorised to spend up to \$50,000 to hire appropriate contractors to remove the textured ceiling coating in the club's building (because it contains asbestos), to repair the ceiling as required, including plastering and painting, and to update the ceiling light fixtures.

The committee plans to have this work done in the first half of 2024.

Change of Elected Officers:

As a single nomination was received for all club positions the nominees were declared to be elected unopposed. Flowers were presented to retiring officers Caroline Griffin, John Fergusson, and Nelda Wormald. Lynne Geursen has been appointed as our new patron and Terry Evans Jr. elected as the new Club Captain. The position of Training and

Most people stayed for the potluck meal after the AGM, and nine tables of drawn pairs (some interesting combinations!) stayed to play bridge after that.
